- Make a commitment to your chapter chief and advisor to be apary of your chapter's ceremonial, dance, or drum team.









COUNCIL QUOTAS

- Due to expected high interest coupled with capacity constraints at Indiana University, National will be instituting a quota for the 2018 NOAC and enforcing a 3:1 youth to adult ratio.
- Each council, regardless of current lodge membership, will receive slots for ten (10) delegates.
- Additional delegates will be assigned as a percentage of your lodge membership as reported on your most recent charter renewal application.



The Number

- We start with the base number of ten (10) Delegates
- Each lodge is allocated 2.13% of their 2017 Renewal Charter (938)
- 938*.0213 = 20
- 20 + 10 = 30 delegates total
- The ratio for Youth to adults is 3 to 1.
- 23 youth and 7 adults



NOAC 2018 KEY DATES

April, 2017 – Quota notification to councils (4/24/2017)

August 1, 2017 – Registration information sent to councils (Fee for the conference will be announced at this time)

October 2, 2017 – Registration system opens for staff and delegate registration (\$100 deposit per delegate charged)

January 2, 2018 – Deadline for councils to claim quota

January 16, 2018 – Unclaimed quota released

March 1, 2018 – Second payment charged to councils

April 2, 2018 – Contingent Leader Guide Distributed & Program Registration Opens

May 31, 2018 – Final Payment Collected (additions after May 31, will result in late fee)


May 31, 2018 – Program registration closes

July 2, 2018 – Delegate Training and Program Schedules available

July 16, 2018 - Program and Incidental Fees charged






The Rough Planning Schedule





