Chapters are a basic unit of the Order of the Arrow. A strong chapter, is the key to a strong Lodge. Chapter functions should be a monthly highlight for these exemplary Scouts and Scouters who have been chosen by their peers as those who "best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives". The chapter is a key organization to foster and grow the arrowmens sense of service to others and his determination to be the kind of Scout his peers have acknowledged him to be. The challenge to personally and dramatically increase the level of service at the chapter level should include a greater foucus on leadership development. membership extension, adventurous programming and broader service to Scouting and the community. Every arrowmen needs three things: a position of

responsibility, a friend, and an understaning of what the order of the Arrow is, it's legends and the meaning of the ordeal ceremony. I challenge each of you to be that friend, "an elengomat" in the language of the the Lenni Lanape. Help your fellow arrowmen to continue to earn the respect and admiration of their peers by living the Scout Oath and Law on a daily basis. Chapter Advisors and Chapter Chiefs, review your rosters and thoughtfully include in the leadership of the chapter as many of your arrowmen as possible. Take time in every meeting to help your fellow arrowmen better understand the legends of the Order of the Arrow. Take time to prepare and make the chapter meeting a special occasion, a meaningful and productive time for your arrowmen to regain a sense of who they are and why they were chosen by their peers to be in Scoutings National Honor Society. Arrowmen, your increased service to the chapter will build a lodge that is strong and vibrant. As your membership retention increases, our ability to serve the council and the community will grow in such a way as to make you proud of the honor you have been given. Let us follow the words of Alowat Sakima, our chief, "He who follows such a vision in unwavering cheerful service, will be seen by many others and by inspiration, lead them. Your in Scouting


